


INTERNATIONAL MINOR PROGRAMME INTERNATIONAL JOURNALISM

ARE YOU INTERESTED IN NEWS MEDIA
AND WORKING AS AN INTERNATIONAL
REPORTER? WOULD YOU LIKE TO
INTERVIEW REFUGEES, ARTISTS OR
POLITICIANS ON CURRENT AFFAIRS? ARE
YOU A CURIOUS PERSON WHO LIKES
TO TELL STORIES, WRITE, PRODUCE
AUDIOVISUAL MATERIAL AND (DIGITAL)
MAGAZINES? WOULD YOU LIKE TO MEET
EXPERIENCED JOURNALISTS AND TAKE
PART IN TWO FIELD REPORTING TRIPS IN
EUROPE?

If this is the case, you should enroll in the minor International Journalism. This minor will help you develop a solid base in understanding, researching and producing journalism. These skills will be put to use on a variety of media platforms.

In the classroom, you'll work on improving your English writing skills in various news genres as well as interviewing in English. You'll be looking at the reporting styles and news angles of various news media, such as the NOS, Al Jazeera, BBC, CBC and Russia Today. Also, you'll be analyzing and reporting on today's conflicts: how they are represented and misrepresented on the many stages of the global news media.



News topics you will report on will range from politics to society and urban culture, economics and more. This minor aims to connect global political developments to national and local news events.

So, if you are a media junkie, with an opinion on what is happening around you, and a good level of English skills, you should take part in the minor International Journalism.

COURSES

In total you can earn 30 EC for the minor.

Journalism and Society

- 6 EC - Portfolio and Exam This course focuses on the international media landscape, different reporting genres, commercialization of the news and how reporters are affected by prejudice and (self) censorship.

International Institutions

- 2 EC - Portfolio

Here you learn about the changing role of international organizations such as the European Union, the United Nations and NATO. What do these institutions do and where is the political power concentrated? How are these institutions affected by the international financial and political crises of the last years?

Media and Conflicts

- 4 EC - Podcast and essay

This course helps you to understand conflicts better by focussing on peace and war journalism, national and international conflicts in the news, art and conflict theory. You will produce a radio podcast on an ongoing social, ethnic or religious conflict, as well as writing an essay on the same topic.

Visual Storytelling

- 6 EC - Portfolio

This course focuses on skills needed to tell a story visually. We cover everything from making video genres to taking and selecting photos, as well as creating and understanding infographics. You will learn how to work with Indesign and learn the basics of magazine layouts.

English for Journalists

- 3 EC - Exam

This is the course in which you are trained to use professional English, working on speaking, reading and writing skills.

Project Im-Press

- 9 EC - Product

Besides the various individual assignments, this minor is a project-based course. Students produce a weekly radio show, several online magazines, a 64-page print magazine and run a weblog for digital storytelling, focusing on current affairs, politics, media and culture. The semester ends with a photo exhibition and a symposium connected to the magazine theme organised by the students. Please have a look at our website www.theinternationalangle.com.

FIELD TRIPS

This minor includes several mandatory field trips in the Netherlands and abroad for which you will need to reserve a budget of around 500 EURO. During the first 10 weeks we visit London, Edinburgh or Dublin based print and television media, and report from the city while we are there. News media we have visited in the past include: BBC, The Independent, Al Jazeera, The Guardian, Russia Today, CBC and Dutch correspondents for NOS, De Volkskrant, Nieuwsuur and Het Financieele Dagblad. In period two we have a full reporting week in which we work from a European city (Istanbul, Madrid, Barcelona, Athens, Vienna, Budapest, Zagreb etc.) as foreign correspondents.

FURTHER INFORMATION

We work together with Free Press Unlimited, which runs several projects supporting media freedom in Eastern Europe, the Middle East and Africa. This minor is conducted fully in English and is labeled 'excellente minor' by the Amsterdam University of Applied Sciences.
